## WHAT: Leon County Driver's License Clinic

## WHEN: Friday, 7 July 2017 at 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM

# WHERE: Leon County Courthouse Annex on Thomasville Road

The Leon County Court will conduct a Driver's License Clinic on July 7, 2017 presided over by Leon County Judge Stephen Everett and Leon County Judge J. Layne Smith.

The purpose is to inform individuals what they need to do to become eligible to legally drive again, and if possible, restore driving privileges through the on-site assistance of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, Department of Revenue, and Leon County Clerk of Court.

There are 250 Leon County residents pre-registered for this Friday. Walk-ins will generally be referred to a second date, Friday, 13 October 2017, although those who can be helped this Friday will be served if space is available.

Additional assistance was/will be provided by the Leon County Sheriff's Office, State Attorney, Public Defender, Leon County Office of Intervention and Detention Alternatives, Leon County Office of Resource Stewardship, and Leon County Tax Collector, Supervisor of Elections, and Property Appraiser.

Constitutional Officers scheduled to be present include Leon County Judge Stephen Everett, Leon County Judge J. Layne Smith, State Attorney Jack Campbell, Public Defender Andy Thomas, and Clerk of Court Gwen Marshall. These individuals will be available for interviews if you would like.
