All registered voters in Leon County are eligible to elect School Board Members based on single member districting.

Each of the School Board's five members shall be a qualified elector of the district in which he or she serves, shall be a resident of the School Board member residence area from which he or she is elected, and shall maintain said residency throughout his or her term of office.

Term begins the 2nd Tuesday after the General Election.

If two or more candidates, neither of whom is a write-in candidate, qualify for such an office, the names of those candidates shall be placed on the ballot at the primary election. If any candidate for such office receives a majority of the votes cast for such election in the primary election, the name of the candidate who receives such majority shall not appear on any other ballot unless a write-in candidate has qualified for such office. If no candidate for such office receives a majority of the votes cast for such office in the primary election, the names of the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for such office shall be placed on the general election ballot. F.S. 105.051

If a vacancy occurs on the School Board, it shall be filled in accordance with F.S. 100.111.
