## A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERVISOR

**“...a Republic, if you can keep it.”**

**- Benjamin Franklin**

Congratulations to Leon County’s citizenry for having the highest voter turnout of any urban county in last August’s primary election. Our turnout percentage almost doubled the turnout percentage for the rest of Florida, and we are counting on you to turnout and vote on November 2, demonstrating again our understanding and commitment to the principle of self governance.

But voting numbers alone are not the only measure of the health of our nation. This was understood clearly by founding father Benjamin Franklin, who perhaps more than any other founder should be credited with ensuring the creation of the United States Constitution – our basis for the modern American nation.

Throughout the long process of crafting our Constitution Benjamin Frankin brought reason, not passion, nor ideology, to the process of crafting this great document. Without his wisdom, the compromises necessary to pass the Constitution could not have occurred.

Upon leaving the Philadelphia hall where our Constitution was crafted a woman called out to him to find out what he and the other founders had created, “...a Republic, if you can keep it.” was Franklin’s quick reply.

These seven words say it all. They tell us “our Constitution is neither a self-actuating nor a self-correcting document.” They tell us our attention, our reason, and our devotion to the concepts embodied in our Constitution are necessary to preserve our Republic. On November 2, let’s remember that, let’s keep it!

### WHAT’S YOUR STATUS

The Leon County Supervisor of Elections Office, in conjunction with the Florida Division of Elections, is providing a new website tool letting you easily check our records to make sure you’re ready to vote. Look for the **MY VOTER STATUS** icon on our homepage, **LeonVotes.org**, to check your party, address, and if you have requested a mail ballot, you can check that too.





# VOTER'S BILL OF RIGHTS

**Each registered voter in this state has the right to:**

1. **Vote and have her or his vote accurately counted.**
2. **Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of the polls in that county.**
3. **Ask for and receive assistance in voting.**
4. **Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast.**
5. **An explanation if her or his registration or identity is in question.**
6. **If her or his registration or identity is in question, cast a provisional ballot.**
7. **Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from elections officers.**
8. **Vote free from coercion or intimidation by elections officers or any other person.**
9. **Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast.**



# VOTER RESPONSIBILITIES

**Each registered voter in this state should:**

1. **Familiarize himself or herself with the candidates and issues.**
2. **Maintain with the office of the Supervisor of Elections a current address.**
3. **Know the location of his or her polling place and its hours of operation.**
4. **Bring proper identification to the polling station.**
5. **Familiarize himself or herself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct.**
6. **Treat precinct workers with courtesy.**
7. **Respect the privacy of other voters.**
8. **Report any problems or violations of election laws to the Supervisor of Elections.**
9. **Ask questions, if needed.**
10. **Make sure that his or her completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station.**



# PROVISIONAL BALLOT

A provisional ballot is given: when the Precinct Clerk is unable to determine a voter's eligibility; a challenge against the voter's eligibility to vote has been filed; the voter's identification has not yet been verified by the State Division of Elections; the voter did not bring his/her voided absentee ballot to the precinct; the voter did not provide the required picture identification to vote; or the hours of voting have been extended by order of the Governor of Florida.

The ballot given to the voter must correspond to the voter's residence address, so it is important to be at the proper polling location. The voter places her or his voted ballot inside a secrecy sleeve, and then inside the affidavit Provisional Ballot Envelope, provided by the Precinct Clerk. The voter must complete the voter's certificate portion of the envelope, remembering to sign the oath. Two more items must be signed by the provisional ballot voter: the Provisional Ballot Disclosure Form and the Florida Voter Registration Application. The Precinct Clerk will provide the voter with the copy of the Provisional Ballot Disclosure Form, as with this form the voter is able to visit the Supervisor of Elections website and determine if her or his provisional ballot was accepted by the Leon County Canvassing Board. You should know that most provisional ballots are accepted by the Leon County Canvassing Board.

## Free Parking Downtown

Once again, the Leon County Board of County Commissioners has approved the first hour free for parking downtown at one of two parking garages to ease the parking shortage for downtown early voting. Those two parking garages are operated by Republic, and are the Kleman Plaza, 306 S. Duval Street, and the garage directly behind the Leon County Courthouse, 215 S. Calhoun Street. Simply affix your "I VOTED" sticker to your parking pass and the first hour is paid for by the Leon County Commissioners.

## 1) EARLY VOTING

Our popular Early Voting is at four locations in 2010. Early Voting locations are the Leon County Fort Braden Library, the Leon County Northeast Library, and the Leon County Woodville Community Center Library, as well as the Leon County Courthouse Rotunda. You can cast your ballot at any location that is convenient to you two weeks prior to Election Day. Voting dates are Monday through Friday, October 18-22, 2010, and Sunday through Saturday, October 24-30, 2010. Voting hours at Early Voting sites once again include Sundays and Saturdays, with hours of operation to meet your busy schedule. The branch locations' hours will be from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., while the Leon County Courthouse Rotunda will be open from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

## 2) BY MAIL BALLOT

If you are unable to make it to your polling place on Election Day, and have no means of transport to an Early Voting location, by all means we still want you to vote! Simply call our office at (850) 606-VOTE, or (850) 606-8683, and press "2" to be connected to our Absentee Ballot Team. Please be sure to allow plenty of time for mail delivery, even within Tallahassee. The deadline to request an absentee ballot is 5:30 p.m., Wednesday, October 27, 2010.

## 3) AT YOUR PRECINCT

Voting at your precinct is your last option to cast your ballot in the election. Voting hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Be sure we have your current residence address correct and for your convenience please bring a picture ID with your signature to vote. If you desire to avoid lines avoid voting during the morning rush hours. Please do your part by studying your proper sample ballot, researching the candidates via the newspaper, websites or other means, and on Tuesday, November 2nd, make your vote count.

Locations Map**



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# ABSENTEE VOTING

Absentee ballots may be requested one election cycle at a time. This may be done in person, by mail, by telephone (850) 606-8683, online at our website, or by sending an email to: [absentee@leoncountyfl.gov](mailto:absentee@leoncountyfl.gov). The email needs to include the full voter name, birthday, residence address and where the ballot would be mailed.

Your absentee ballot request must be renewed each election cycle. If you want to receive absentee ballots for any elections in 2012, you must contact us beginning in 2011.

Please note that absentee ballots cannot be forwarded by the Post Office. If your ballot is returned as undeliverable, your future ballot requests will be canceled. Should you ever have a question about your absentee ballot, call us at (850) 606-8683.

## Military and Overseas Information

Military personnel, their spouses, dependents, and overseas US citizens may apply for voter registration or request mail ballots with a Federal Post Card Application. These can be obtained from the Unit Voting Officer or can be accessed online through the website [www.fvap.gov](http://www.fvap.gov).

Voters that will be overseas on Election Day can request to receive absentee ballots also by email and then return the ballot by fax transmission before 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Please call for more information about this service.

### REQUEST DEADLINE

The deadline to request an absentee ballot will be at 5:30 pm EST on Wednesday, October 27th, 2010. 101.62(2) F.S. This may be done in person, by mail, by telephone at 850-606-8683 or online at our website: [LeonVotes.org](http://LeonVotes.org)

NOTE: PLEASE READ INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE MARKING YOUR BALLOT AND COMPLETING THE VOTER'S CERTIFICATE.

① Place your voted ballot inside the secrecy sleeve and then seal it in this envelope.

② **VOTER'S CERTIFICATE** You must sign this oath.

I, \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear or affirm that I am a qualified registered voter of Leon County, Florida, and that I have not and will not vote more than one ballot in this election. I understand that if I commit or attempt to commit any fraud in connection with voting, vote a fraudulent ballot, or vote more than once in an election, I can be convicted of a felony of the third degree and fined up to \$5,000, and/or imprisoned for up to 5 years. I also understand that failure to sign this certificate will invalidate my ballot.

③ Ballot must be received by the Supervisor of Elections by no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

HAVE YOU SIGNED?

Mail your ballot in time to be received by our office no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, November 2nd, 2010.

If you think there is not enough time for the US Postal Service to route your ballot to us, it can be hand-delivered directly to our office by you or someone you choose. Ballots received after 7:00 p.m. on November 2nd, 2010 will not count in this election. Ballots can also be hand-delivered to our Early Voting sites during their two weeks of operation.

### **BRING YOUR PHOTO ID WITH YOU WHEN YOU VOTE**

Current and valid picture ID, such as:

FL Driver's License

FL Identification Card

US Passport

Debit or Credit Card

Military ID

Student ID

Retirement Center ID

Neighborhood Association ID

Public Assistance ID

If the picture ID does not contain the signature of the voter, an additional ID that provides the voter's signature shall be required. Voters at precincts without proper ID will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot.
