

My name has changed.

How can I update my voter registration?

You can change your name on your voter registration record by completing a Florida Voter Registration Application or by a signed written notice that includes your date of birth. You can download and print the Florida Voter Registration application from our website: www.LeonVotes.org. You can mail your completed form or signed written notice to Supervisor of Elections P.O. Box 7357, Tallahassee, Florida 32301. Or, you can submit this change in person at 315 S. Calhoun St., Suite 110 in the Bank of America building directly behind the Leon County Courthouse.

If my Voter Information Card is lost or stolen, how do I get a replacement?

Contact our office by phone at (850) 606-VOTE (8683), or on our website at www.LeonVotes.org.

How do I know where to vote?

Your precinct name and address can be found on your Voter Information Card, on our website: www.LeonVotes.org at the My Voter Status page, or you can call our office at (850) 606-VOTE (8683).

What if I am unable to vote at my precinct on Election Day?

There are 2 ways to vote in Leon County before Election Day:

- 1) You may request that a ballot be mailed to your residence, mailing, or temporary address.
- 2) Vote early at one of our Early Voting locations before an Election. Check our website for dates, times and locations.

To request a ballot or find information regarding Early Voting locations and hours you may visit our website or call our office.

What identification do I need to vote?

You should present valid photo identification with a signature, such as a Florida Driver's License. Two separate valid acceptable forms of identification may be presented, such as a Student ID with a picture and a Credit or Debit card with a signature.

Note: The address on your Florida Driver's License does not have to match the address on your voter registration.

A complete list of acceptable forms of identification includes:

- Florida Driver's License
- Florida Identification Card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles
- United States Passport
- Debit or Credit card
- Military Identification
- Student Identification
- Retirement center identification
- Neighborhood association identification
- Public assistance identification

FAQ

Can anyone register to vote?

No. You must be a Citizen of the United States and a legal resident of the State of Florida.

Can a convicted felon register to vote?

No. A person who has been convicted of a felony by any court is ineligible to register to vote until they have had their voting rights restored.

How do I know if my voting rights have been restored?

I am a resident of Leon County, but currently have no physical address. Can I register to vote?

Yes. If you are homeless you may register to vote using a shelter address as your residence and if you have a place where you receive your mail, that address should be used as your mailing address. If you are U.S. military, or a U.S. citizen residing overseas more detailed voter registration information can be obtained at www.FVAP.gov. You may also view information about Absentee Voting on our website: www.LeonVotes.org, or call our office at (850) 606-VOTE (8683).

Can I register before I turn 18?

Yes. You may pre-register at 16. However, you can only vote in elections occurring on or after your 18th birthday.

If I am not currently registered, what is the registration deadline for an election?

The registration deadline is 29 days prior to an election.

★ Where can I go to register to vote?

Register to vote at the Supervisor of Elections office or any of our Registration Branch Sites. ★ Do I have to re-register to vote if I change my address?

No. You can make an address change within Leon County, or into Leon County from another Florida County by:

★ I am a college student in Leon County. Can I vote here or should I register to vote using my parent's address?

- If you reside in Leon County for school you are eligible to register to vote here. This may be the most convenient option considering that many voting precincts are located on or near our local campuses.
- If you choose to maintain your voter registration at your parent's residence, you must request an absentee ballot from that Florida County, or State jurisdiction.
- This information is subject to change by Legislative Action. Updates will be posted on our website LeonVotes.org as well as on the FL Division of Elections' website.

★ I've moved since the last time I voted, and forgot to change my address. Can I go to my old precinct to vote?

No. You must vote in the precinct assigned to your new address. You may search for your new precinct on our website, or call our office at (850) 606-VOTE (8683).

Do I have to choose a political party?

No. You are not required to choose a political party, however, Florida has Closed Primaries. In a Closed Primary, you are eligible to vote in a partisan primary race only if you are a registered member of the political party in the race. You may not participate in more than one political party's primary race. Party affiliation changes must be made 29 days before a Primary Election.

Note: In Leon County's Primary Election there are many non partisan races that voters will be eligible for regardless of party affiliation. General Elections are open to voters regardless of party affiliation.

Am I eligible to vote for all races in a particular Election?

No. In addition to Closed Primaries, voters are only eligible to vote on races that are assigned to their precincts. Your Voter Information Card lists your Congressional, State Senate, State House, County Commission, School Board districts and whether you live inside or outside the city limits of Tallahassee. How do I change my political party?

You can change your party affiliation by completing a Florida Voter Registration Application or by a signed written notice that includes your date of birth. You can download and print the Florida Voter Registration application from our website: www.LeonVotes.org. You can mail your completed form or signed written notice to Supervisor of Elections P.O. Box 7357, Tallahassee, Florida 32301. Or, you can submit this change in person at 315 S. Calhoun St., Suite 110 in the Bank of America building directly behind the Leon County Courthouse.
